

Materials:

The Drink Coaster Design of your choice

2 pieces of Tearaway backing per design

2 Pieces of applique fabric (we used twill)

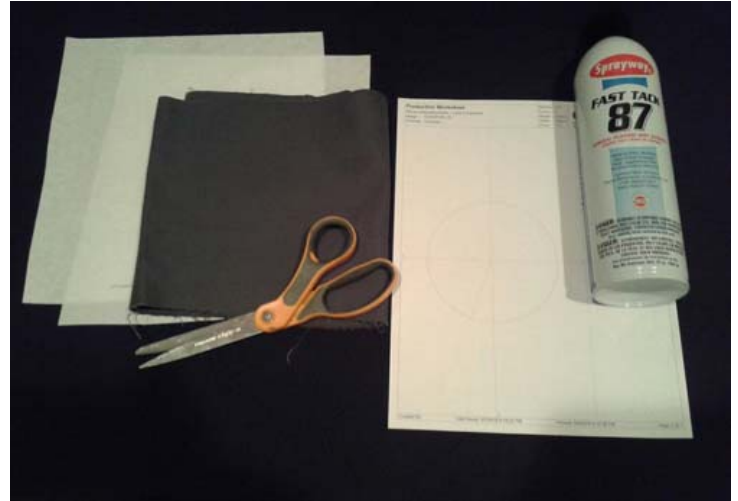
2 Pieces of paper for the dieline printouts

Thread & Bobbin Thread (same color)

Sharp 11 Needle

Spray Adhesive

Scissors

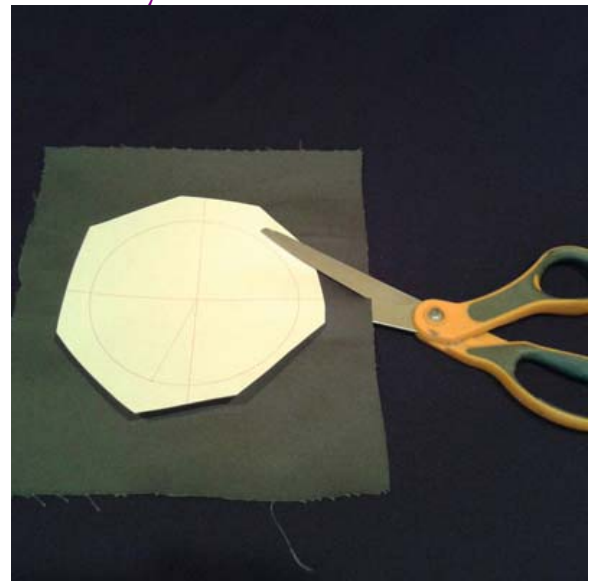


The first thing to do is print the dieline file. Locate the file with the -a at the end of the file name and print it with your embroidery software and a printer. Print 2 each of the -a files, you will use them as the front and back applique pieces. If you do not have embroidery software, a great program to use is Wilcom TrueSizer which is a free download online. As a side note, two of the SEW file formats also have -b & -c files which are split embroidery files.

Step 1:

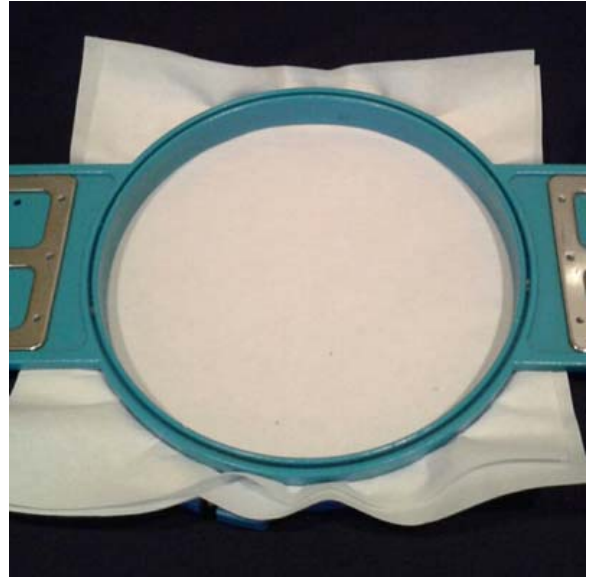
Cut the paper down close to the template of each of the papers.

Use a light temporary spray adhesive and spray on the back of your paper templates. Place each paper template onto your applique fabric pieces. Cut the applique fabric and paper along the template dieline for each of the applique pieces. Remove the paper template. Set the applique pieces aside.



Step 2:

Hoop a piece of tearaway stabilizer. Place the hoop on the machine and embroider the first color stop which is the first dieline. Go to the next step.



Step 3:

Lightly spray the back of one of the applique fabric pieces with the adhesive.



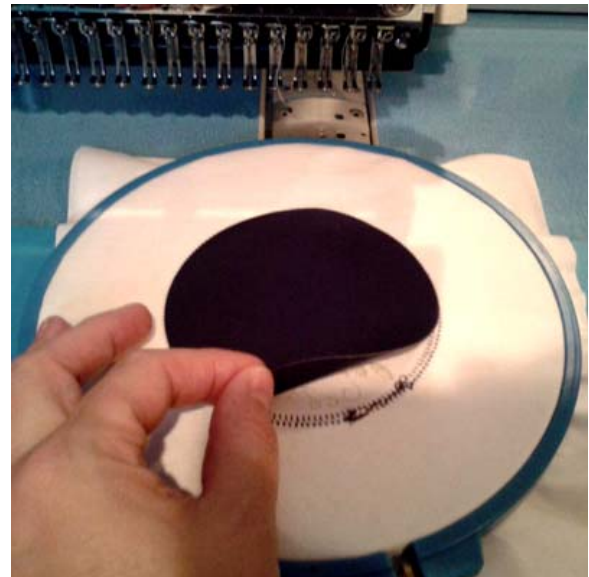
Step 4:

Place the applique inside the dieline. Start the machine again and embroider thru to the stop just before the next dieline, stop the machine and remove the hoop.



Step 5:

This dieline is for the back applique piece. Remove hoop from machine and flip hoop over to back side. **(DO NOT REMOVE DESIGN FROM HOOP.)** Lightly Spray the back applique with adhesive and place inside the dielines. Gently rehoop and it will tackdown the backside to the front. Continue sewing until the final color stop.



Step 6:

Remove the design from the hoop then gently tearaway the stabilizer from your new drink coaster.



Step 7:

Using a scissors very carefully trim away any excess stabilizer from around the outside of your coaster.
